### **Annual Report of Activities of FY 2023-24**

The Annual General Body Meeting of the society was held on 16<sup>th</sup> July 2024, at C-47, Lane No. 4, Mahendru Enclave, Delhi, as per the bye-laws and provisions of the Multi-State Cooperative Societies Act, 2002. The annual accounts, activity plan, and compliance matters were discussed and approved.

1. A meeting of the members of the society was organized to motivate members for aggregation and trading business activities. During the meeting, the formation of three new Multi-State Cooperative Societies (MSCS) in the sectors of seed production, organic products, and export marketing was discussed. Members were encouraged to actively participate in seed and organic production activities. It was unanimously agreed to initiate these activities, and a formal communication is to be sent to seek membership from the three new MSCS, which will help RAMCO and its members in establishing effective backward and forward linkages.

A discussion was carried out and a roadmap was prepared to explore collaboration under the Arth Ganga framework of the National Mission for Clean Ganga, Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India. The society resolved to align its activities with this initiative, focusing on the promotion of natural farming, sustainable agriculture, and the creation of livelihoods for communities residing in the Ganga Basin.
3. The issue of availability of fertilisers, both chemical and organic, was raised by members during the meeting. It was proposed to explore the possibility of starting fertiliser supply and distribution operations with institutional support from IFFCO and KRIBHCO, in order to meet the timely requirements of member farmers and ensure affordable access to quality agri inputs.
4. The members of the society expressed the need to conduct farmer training programmes on key areas such as natural farming, the use and production of bio-fertilisers, and scientific seed production. It was suggested that the society should collaborate with expert institutions and relevant government agencies to organize such programmes in the upcoming year.
